

Die Autorin behandelt in ihrer Dissertation die Frage, ob die Gründung von UN Women im Jahr 2010 durch die Zusammenlegung von vier anderen UN-Unterorganisationen als Wechsel in der Gleichstellungspolitik der UN oder nur als Restrukturierung zu werten ist. Dafür zeichnet sie zunächst die Geschichte der Rolle von Frauen in der politischen und organisatorischen Entwicklung der Vereinten Nationen nach und analysiert das moderne Völkerrecht hinsichtlich der Rechte und dem Schutz von Frauen sowie bestehender Rechtslücken. Anschließend diskutiert die Autorin die Entstehungsgeschichte von UN Women und erörtert ihre Bedeutung im institutionellen, politischen und rechtlichen Kontext. Sie kommt zu dem Schluss, dass die Gründung


von UN Women einen klaren Mehrwert gebracht hat. Das Dreifach-Mandat der Unterorganisation (normative Unterstützung, innerorganisatorische Kooperation und operationelle Tätigkeit) ermöglicht es, Fragen der Geschlechtergleichberechtigung effizienter im gesamten UN-System behandeln zu können. Zudem vertritt UN Women ein weites Verständnis von Gender und bezieht auch die LGBTI\*-Community ein. Die Autorin weist aber auch darauf hin, dass der Erfolg von UN Women maßgeblich vom Willen der Mitgliedstaaten abhängt, sowohl was die Umsetzung von internationalem Recht und die Kooperation mit UN Women angeht, als auch hinsichtlich der Finanzierung dieser UN-Unterorganisation.


NGOs headquartered in the North have been, for some time, prominent actors in attempts to address the poverty, lack of political representation, and labor exploitation that disproportionately affect women from the global South. Feminist NGOs and NGOs focusing on women's rights have been successful in attracting attention to their causes, but critics argue that the highly educated elites from the global North and South who run them fail to effectively question the power hierarchies in which they operate. In order to give depth to these criticisms, Sara de Jong interviewed women NGO workers in seven different European countries about their experiences and perspectives on working on gendered issues affecting women in the global South as well as migrant women in the global North. Complicit Sisters untangles and analyzes the complex tensions women NGO workers face and explores the ways in which they negotiate potential complicities in their work. Unlike other studies looking at development workers "on the ground," this book examines the women NGO workers in the global North who work to influence high level gender advocacy and policy, alongside women NGO workers supporting migrant women within the global North--a unique combination. Weighing the women's first-hand accounts against critiques arising from feminist theory, postcolonial theory, global civil society theory and critical development literature, de Jong brings to life the dilemmas of "doing good."







### **Weber, Cynthia: Queer International Relations (Oxford Studies in Gender and International Relations): Sovereignty, Sexuality and the Will to Knowledge 2016**

If asked about queer work in international relations, most IR scholars would almost certainly answer that queer studies is a non-issue for the subdiscipline -- a topic beyond the scope and understanding of international politics. Yet queer work tackles problems that IR scholars themselves believe are central to their discipline: questions about political economies, the geopolitics of war and terror, and the national manifestations of sexual, racial, and gendered hierarchies, not to mention their implications for empire, globalization, neoliberalism, sovereignty, and terrorism. And since the introduction of queer work in the 1980s, IR scholars have used queer concepts like "performativity" or "crossing" in relation to important issues like sovereignty and security without acknowledging either their queer sources or their queer function.

This agenda-setting book asks how "sexuality" and "queer" are constituted as domains of international political practice and mobilized so that they bear on questions of state and nation formation, war and peace, and international political economy. How are sovereignty and sexuality entangled in contemporary international politics? What understandings of sovereignty and sexuality inform contemporary theories and foreign policies on development, immigration, terrorism, human rights, and regional integration? How specifically is "the homosexual" figured in these theories and policies to support or contest traditional understandings of sovereignty? Queer International Relations puts international relations scholarship and transnational/global queer studies scholarship in conversation to address these questions and their implications for contemporary international politics.





**Eichler, Maya (Hrsg.): Gender and Private Security in Global Politics (Oxford Studies in Gender and International Relations) 2015**

For two hundred years the provision of military security has been a central and defining function of the modern nation-state. The increasing reliance on private military and security companies in contemporary conflict marks a fundamental transformation in the organization of military violence, and it raises issues of accountability and ethics that are of particular concern to feminists. This privatization of force not only enables states to circumvent citizens' democratic control over questions of war and peace, but also undermines women's and minority groups' claims for greater inclusion in the military sphere.

Gender and Private Security in Global Politics brings together key scholars from the fields of international relations, security studies, and gender studies to argue that privatization of military security is a deeply gendered process. The chapters employ a variety of feminist perspectives, including critical, postcolonial, poststructuralist, and queer feminist perspectives, as well as a wide range of methodological approaches including ethnography, participant-observation, genealogy, and discourse analysis. This is the first book to develop an extended feminist analysis of private militaries and to draw on feminist concerns regarding power, justice and equality to consider how to reform and regulate private forces.

Expanding on the issues she originally explored in her classic work, *Gender in International Relations*, J. Ann Tickner focuses her distinctively feminist approach on new issues of the international relations agenda since the end of the Cold War, such as ethnic conflict and other new security issues, globalizations, democratization, and human rights. As in her previous work, these topics are placed in the context of brief reviews of more traditional approaches to the same issues. She also looks at the considerable feminist work that has been published on these topics since the previous book came out.

Tickner highlights the misunderstandings that exist between mainstream and feminist approaches, and explores how these debates developed in the new environment of post Cold War international relations.
